Woodland Youth Enjoy Leadership/Empowerment Experience at Camp Royal

Camp Royal has provided an incredible leadership experience to high school students from throughout Rotary District 5160. Last year ~140 students experienced Camp Royal. **Interested?** Visit www.camproyal.org for more information.

Camp Royal is set in northern California near Mount Shasta, away from all distractions like cell phones, internet and Face Book. Students are transported to camp via bus. Reactions to camp were all positive. First words to describe the event were “Amazing” (Rebecca G.), “Life Changing” (Mia J.) and “Awesome” (Jonathan C.). “It is a camp that drives you to do something extraordinary, showing one it is okay to fail, and what it truly means to persevere”. “It builds your self confidence from inside out and teaches you to rid yourself of that little voice that says you cannot do it”.

The three Rotary Clubs of Woodland (Woodland Noon, Woodland Sunrise and Luna Vista Woodland) are proud to sponsor students from their community. Selections are based on the application, involvement in school and community, and personal statements. Woodland Rotary clubs are committed to youth and Camp Royal is an example of that support.

Camp Royal emphasizes self empowerment and leadership objectives:

1. Campers will realize that they must take responsibility for themselves and the outcome of their decisions and future.
2. Campers will have an opportunity to collaborate in small teams to overcome obstacles and accomplish tasks they could not do alone.
3. Campers will experience the process of inspiring a large group to achieve a common goal.

The most important outcome of this experience for the students is NOT the success or failure of any particular task or project, but rather the realization of how much more they accomplish in groups working together toward common goals - how to lead, how to follow, and how to be part of something larger than themselves. This is a remarkable outcome considering that most of these kids are leaders to start with, and are used to success and being in charge.

Last year’s participants all stated that camp exceeded their expectations, with activities that increase personal awareness and potential, defining goals and empowering one to move toward those goals.

“It opens your mind, empowering you, knowing you are capable of doing anything” (Jonathan C.)

“It is a place that allows new ideas, real life and is accepting”, (Janelly C.).

“We learned how to mentally and physically get over the wall to overcome obstacles now and in the future” (Rebecca G.).

“I thought it would be a traditional leadership camp with team building games, it was way better, you dig in and discover yourself” (Mia J.)
