Thank you for joining the Rotary Club of Woodland, chartered in 1926, for our annual fund raising dinner/auction event. This year's theme is "Helping Us Help Our Community and the World." With this year's proceeds, we will help the Woodland Memorial Hospital purchase a Cheetah Monitor that measures fluid responsiveness for patients with severe sepsis or septic shock. Your generosity, together with the generosity of our sponsors and club members, allows us to carry on an 82-year tradition of helping those less fortunate, both in our community and around the world.

It is my fervent belief that Rotary is one of the best kept secrets in the world. Rotary is a world-wide organization and the Woodland Rotary Club is but one of three clubs in our fine city. The club has been responsible for many community projects, including assisting with the Locatelli family medical expenses, funding a play structure at Greengate School and CommuniCare offices at Cache Creek High School, helping fund the Woodland Robotics Team to travel to finals competition, helping sponsor the FFA auction at the Yolo County Fair, hosting the annual Senior BBQ at Rotary Park, providing scholarships to WHS and PHS valedictorians (valued at \$6,000 each), co-sponsoring the Woodland Kids Read Program, and contributing \$20,000 to the Yolo Food Bank, to name a few. On a global level, the club has co-sponsored cervical cancer prevention projects in Kenya and Nicaragua, donated thousands of dollars to the eradication of polio, and contributed \$1,000 toward a Tanzania dental clinic.

As you can see, Rotary not only works to better our community members, we also help to better the lives of folks around the world.

DINNER/AUCTION

Welcome to the 2018 Woodland Rotary Endowment Dinner/Auction. This is our largest fund raising event of the year. Net proceeds go to benefit our community and the world. In addition to Woodland Memorial Hospital's Cheetah Monitor, the Endowment continues to provide four-year scholarships to the top graduates from Woodland and Pioneer High Schools. During the year, other community and world needs are identified and funds are provided for them as well.

This year our net proceeds are being directed to the Woodland Memorial Hospital, via the Woodland Healthcare Foundation, for the purchase of a Cheetah Monitor. This monitor will allow the bedside nurse and/or physician to monitor fluid responsiveness for patients with severe sepsis or septic shock. The Cheetah Monitor will also replace the current treatment plan, an invasive procedure, which places a central line in the patient's chest. Thank you for your assistance in allowing us to purchase this lifesaving device.
