I want to thank each of you for joining the Rotary Club of Woodland, chartered in 1926, for our annual fund raising dinner and auction. This year's theme is **WoodlandStock, 50 Years from Woodstock, It's a Hippie Thing! Peace, Love & Music**. With this year's proceeds, we will help F.I.R.E. (First In, Response for Evacuees), NorCal Tyrkers, and the Woodland United Way Imagination Library. Your generosity, together with the generosity of our sponsors and club members, will allow us to continue a 90-year plus tradition of helping the less fortunate.

It is my belief that Rotary is one of the best kept secrets in the world. Not only is Rotary a community organization, it is also a world-wide organization, and the Rotary Club of Woodland is but one of three clubs in this fine community. Our club has been responsible for many community projects, including assisting with the Locatelli family medical expenses, funding a play structure at Greengate School, hosting the annual Senior BBQ at Rotary Park, providing scholarships to the Woodland High School and Pioneer High School valedictorians (valued at \$6,000 each), contributing over \$10,000 to Northern California fire victims, helping to sponsor the FAA auction at the Yolo County Fair, and our most recent joint project, constructing a playground at the Herbert Bouer M.D. Building of the Yolo County Health and Human Services Agency on Cottonwood Street. On a global level, the club has co-sponsored cervical cancer prevention projects in Kenya and Nicaragua and has donated thousands of dollars to the eradication of polio.

As you can see, Rotary not only works to better the lives of our community members, but also helps to better the lives of folks around the world.

F.I.R.E. is currently building an 8-stall shower trailer that will bring the comfort of a hot shower into evacuation centers that do not have these facilities. After evacuating your home and staying in a facility for an indefinite amount of time, a shower is not a luxury, but a necessity for health and well being.
