President's Message:



I would like to start by saying thank you to everyone in attendance tonight and thank you to all of the Rotarians who have donated their time, talent and treasure to put tonight's event together. I hope that you thoroughly enjoy this evening's Tailgate Party while allowing Rotary to achieve its goal of helping our community.

The Rotary Club of Woodland has been serving our community for almost 100 years. Since being chartered

in 1926, Rotary has completed numerous projects; they cannot all be listed in the space provided. I would like to highlight a few of the prior ones: the Cheetah Monitors provided to Woodland Memorial Hospital, the new and refurbished musical instruments for the Woodland schools' band programs, and the electronic marquee at Woodland Community College. At last year's auction, we provided ten custom-built bicycles for special needs individuals, funded a generator for F.I.R.E. to complete their shower trailer used at disaster evacuation sites, and assisted the Woodland United Way in launching the Imagination Library, which provides a book a month for five years to children born in Yolo County.

This year, with your help, we will assist in the rebuilding of a portion of our community stadium. In 1971, Woodland volunteers joined together to build the Woodland Community Stadium. When it was constructed, it was considered to be state-of-the-art. In 1973, the stadium hosted the California State High School Track and Field competition. Five California State records were set that day on the heralded fast track.

Almost five decades after the construction of the original stadium was completed, our community is ready to rebuild a new one. The Rotary Club of Woodland is proud to be part of this major reconstruction project. We have committed to fund the replacement of the score board.

Woodland High School will be the major beneficiary of tonight's fundraiser. Additionally, funds raised will be used to support a variety of worthy community projects.

Thank you all for your support in furthering Rotary's commitment to improving our community.



Proceeds from this year's auction will go to benefit Woodland High School. The high school opened in 1972. They are the process of rebuilding their football stadium that was deemed unsafe given it's age and condition. The new \$8.2M stadium will be state-of-the-art, larger, and have new bathrooms and a new snack shack. In January of 2020, the Rotary Club of Woodland, Noon, agreed to help in the acquisition of and placement of a new scoreboard at this new stadium. We feel this project is very worthwhile and will give the students and community something to be proud of for decades to come.

- Please pay for silent auction items before the oral auction begins.

50/50 RAFFLE


(\$20 for 25 tickets)

A bottle of 2016 Napa Valley Cabernet Sauvignon from the Peterson Family Vineyard in Calistoga, rated 96 points. Winemaker Bob Foley notes, "Intense dark fruit aromas of black cherry and black currant indicate the ripeness and purity of this beautiful Cabernet. The structural framework is sturdy, while tannin grips very gently, carrying the fruit flavors with a trace of vanilla into a long, graceful finish." From wine critic Jeb Dunnuck: "The 100% varietal 2016 Cabernet Sauvignon comes from a site in Calistoga and was raised in 50% new French oak. It offers impressive amounts of cassis and blueberry fruits intermixed with lots of sappy herbs, incense, and California bay leaflike nuances. Full-bodied, rockingly concentrated and powerful, vet still elegant and seamless. It's a seriously good Napa Cabernet that might just be one of the best at the under 100-dollar price point." In English, it means this a good bottle of wine!

But wait!! On top of this magnificent bottle of Cabernet: A bottle of a 2016 Napa Valley Merlot from the same vineyard. Enticing red fruit bowl aromas of raspberry, red cherry, and cassis are graced with just a hint of savory spice. The flavors flood the palate with a rich mouthful of deliciousness that brings on espresso-like nuances. This structure and balance resolve in a mouth-coating finish that seems to go on forever. Rated 94 points.

Personalized Flights of Discovery—take a Discovery Flight with Oscar 41 Aviators Flight Club at Watts-Woodland Airport. hunting in a group. No meals will be included unless you like rabbit. Our hunting season ends the first week of March 2020 and resumes in September.
