From the President...



"What is Rotary"? This is a question that many Rotarians have received for nearly 100 years in Woodland, California. When I am asked this question, I usually talk about "service to our local community"—listing the many projects around town that proudly display the symbol you see above. I talk about Meals On Wheels, our Annual Senior BBQ, and "passing the hat to help a young boy hear." I let them know that each Tuesday we Rotarians have lunch together, and it's always

accompanied with a laugh or two. We have Christmas parties, a "Mystery Golf" outing, and bus trips to watch the San Francisco Giants. Each year, our Club awards a \$6000 scholarship to each of the valedictorians at Woodland and Pioneer High Schools. These are just some of the things that Rotary does to help make our community better. Rotary also has an impact on the global community as well. There are over 46,000 Rotary Clubs in over 200 countries, with a stated mission "to provide service to others, promote integrity, and advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through fellowship...." Our local Rotarians have helped international causes, such as Polio Plus (to eradicate polio) and a WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) project that built storage tanks and hand-washing basins at a school in Karen, Kenya. Rotary has had a lasting, positive impact on so many lives, near and far.

Tonight, our theme is "The Community Chest." Traditionally, our annual fundraiser has selected a single recipient of the event's proceeds. This year, however, under the guidance of President-Elect Karl Diekman, our club chose to benefit the multiple local groups listed in this program. Each of these groups are highly deserving and we believe, through your generous giving, we can truly help better the lives of those around us. Tabb Randolph and his team of dedicated volunteers have put together a fantastic night with dinner provided by Anderson Family Catering and a Dessert Auction! DINNER / AUCTION

The following organizations are the 2023 beneficiaries of partial funding to support local community needs.

The Bike Campaign

Purchase new, secure bike racks and two new bike fleets for Woodland elementary schools. The Bike Campaign has been operational for 11+ years, has a Bike Garage at Douglass Middle School and provides bike training skills for 2nd through 6th graders.

Friends of Yolo Adult Day Health Center

Acquire new equipment and curriculum to promote exercise and sensory stimulation; also, to improve existing equipment/programs that promote the health and wellbeing of those in need of adult day health services.

MOSAIC Children's Museum

Funding to enlarge the Toddler Exhibit to include a child/parent reading area and climbing activity area and to purchase books and exhibits, all of which are favorite activities for the toddler age group.

Yolo County Fair Improvement Project

Construct a new auction arena to show and sell FFA and 4-H project animals raised by Yolo County youth.

Yolo Crisis Nursery

Support for the Brighter Tomorrows Campaign to build a new home to meet the increasing demand for providing specialized care for children whose families are experiencing a crisis. The Nursery operates 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year, and is available for newborn through 5-year-old children.

Woodland Little League

Replace fencing and upgrade the aging infrastructure at Camarena Field to reduce the safety risk for both players and spectators.

All Leaders Must Serve (ALMS)

Support ALMS in training 15 young adults from Cesar Chavez Neighborhood School, Cache Creek, Woodland High and Pioneer High Schools, mentoring their efforts to enter the workplace successfully.

50/50 RAFFLE



Durant Olive Mill is the premier purveyor of Oregon milled Extra Virgin Olive Oil and home to the only Olioteca in the Pacific Northwest. Founded in 2008, Durant Olive Mill is home to 17 acres of olive trees and a state-of-the-art Italian mill.

This tour can be enjoyed for up to ten friends and family. The tour should take two to three hours or all day if you want to walk a bit or just nap in the shade. Our farm is located in Colusa and Yolo Counties, a 30-minute drive north from Woodland, off I-5 north of Dunnigan on County Line Road. Guaranteed to be enjoyed by all ages; and who knows, you just might get hooked on the farm life!
